Social Justice and Action

From Rabbi Stein



Every two years, our Reform movement holds an important gathering in Washington, DC. Hosted by the Religious Action Center, the Consultation on Conscience is very different than the Biennials and other conferences. The Consultation is a unique opportunity to come together with other Reform Jews who want to reflect on significant social justice issues and social action opportunities. While still a sizeable gathering, it is a much more intimate opportunity to engage with the national leaders of our movement than at Biennial, where several thousand people come together.

I have been very pleased that TBK sent a substantial delegation to the last two Consultations. Each time, our group came home inspired and ready to take action. In particular, after the 2017 Consultation, we were able to enhance our engagement in several ways, in particular looking at how we can work in support of refugees and migrants, on issues of poverty, and in solidarity with Women of the Wall. Thanks to our discussions that began at Consultation, we are actively working to increase our meaningful engagement in advocacy activities with state and federal officials.

Plans are underway for the 2019 Consultation on Conscience. The conference will take place in DC from May 19-21. While this may seem far off, I share this now for two reasons. First,

because of busy schedules, it is important to save the date and carve out that time for this essential learning and action opportunity. Second, there is a special deep discount to those who register between November 1 and 23. While there will continue to be early bird discounts, the opportunity to register during this first period includes an even more significant reduction in the conference fee.

While the temple does have scholarship funds available for the Consultation, it is obviously helpful if the members of our delegation take advantage of the reduced rates.

Registration happens through the Religious Action Center website, rac.org. Please contact me directly for information on the code you will need to receive the full discount. And, please be in touch if you are considering participating and need more information.

The Consultation on Conscience is a very special and important gathering. I have participated for many years and always come home inspired, informed, and ready to engage in new and significant ways. I look forward to travelling with a diverse delegation of TBK members, so we can learn together and come home ready to take action together.

Women of the Wall: A Conversation with Rabbi Stein

Shortly before Rosh Hashanah, Ayala Emmett asked Rabbi Stein if he would be interviewed about Women of the Wall.

AYALA Since Temple B'rith Kodesh committed, made a brit to support Women of the Wall in 2017, I wanted to talk to you about this project. I wanted to ask you about the painful paradox of the Kotel, a sacred space for Jews around the world and a site of violence and exclusions.

RABBI STEIN In 2011, I was at the Kotel with my congregation celebrating B'nai Mitzvah and at the end I carried a Torah scroll to return it. An Orthodox man in black clothing stopped and kissed the Torah I was holding. My first thought was one of joy, of feeling connected, and united. My next thought was whether he would have done it if I were with the Women of the Wall or would he have joined the attackers.

AYALA Women of the Wall fight for gender equality and religious pluralism in Israel has been going on since 1988 and is raging as we speak.

RABBI STEIN Cognizant of the women's struggle for religious pluralism and justice, I thought that it was important to recognize their struggle. I chose to include reciting the Rosh Hodesh prayer in support of Women of Wall. Rosh Hodesh literally translated as "the head of the month," is the celebration of each new month of the Hebrew calendar. Women of the Wall chose Rosh Hodesh as the day to gather as a women's prayer group and celebrate, through prayer at the Kotel and reading the special portion for Rosh Hodesh from the Torah scroll.

Congregants have questions about the new Give To Your Heart's Content membership model. Here are answers to some of the most common:

Q. Why is a change being made?

A. It is TBK's desire to transition from a model based on assigned "dues" to one where we ask members to "give from their hearts". As Rabbi Stein said, "Membership should not rely on fixed dues. Rather, we should return to the Torah's image of contributions that come from the heart."

Q. How will this be different from how things worked previously?

A. Instead of paying an assigned dues amount, each member household is asked to fairly assess its own commitment level and to give accordingly.

Q. Is this a way for TBK to raise more money?

A. This is not a new/added fundraising initiative. On average, the 80+ congregations across the country that have made this change have seen a slight increase in contributions (roughly 2%). Instead, this is a shift to making membership more relational than transactional.

Q. I can give whatever amount I choose?

A. Yes. It is our hope that people will continue to give at their current level, or if possible, even an increased amount, so we can continue to provide the same level of services, education and programming. However, whatever people decide is the appropriate amount for them personally will be accepted gratefully. Your pledge is an investment in the temple's future, and ensuring it continues as a house of prayer, a community, and a place of education. We ask you to support TBK in a manner that is meaningful to you.

Q. Is this "Sustaining Amount" that I have heard about the replacement for what was previously known as "full dues"?

A. No. The Sustaining Amount is the amount that would meet our financial needs if every membership unit gave that amount. However, the majority of member units currently pay less than that amount.

Q. How will I designate my commitment amount?

A. You will receive a brochure in the mail that describes the new membership model. It will include a simple form that you can fill out and return to TBK. You can also call the temple office to designate your amount.

Q. Will I still receive a statement?

A. Yes, you will still receive periodic statements showing what you have paid and how much is left to pay towards your annual commitment.

Q. What if I don't designate my commitment level?

A. Your current dues will be considered to be your commitment level and you will continue to receive statements for that amount.

Q. What if I still have questions?

Women of the Wall

AYALA So given that the women are being violently attacked for doing what we in a Reform synagogue take for granted, what should we say or do about the Kotel?

RABBI STEIN I see the importance of continuing to talk about it is as a way of preserving the Kotel as a place of gathering of all the Jewish people. We pay attention to it not because we are Reform Jews but because it was the historic spiritual focus for all the Jewish people. The reason to stand with Women of the Wall is because the Kotel is the place to come together. It is a place for kol am yisrael. Everyone has a place there. I have a friend, a Reform rabbi in Israel, who told me that she refuses to go to Kotel. She puts her energy into building up the Reform synagogues in Israel as places of equality. This is important, but at the same time, I don't want to lose the Kotel.

AYALA What would you tell people at TBK who plan on travelling to Israel? What should they be looking for?

RABBI STEIN The first thing I tell people is to connect with Kehilot not the Kotel. When I was in Modi'in I stayed with people who live a chiloni, a secular, life. My hosts were people who have never been in a Reform synagogue. I wanted to go the reform synagogue and my host joined me. The rabbi was an American Oleh and there was a visiting American group and some Israelis. My host said to me, "I am sure it was a nice service for you." I hope that we can find a balance where the Reform synagogues serve the needs of the Israelis and are also important places for visitors to attend. I would say to those who travel to Israel to visiting local synagogues, to connect with Israeli life. A good way to do it is to listen more than speak. Make an effort to forge close relations with Israelis.

AYALA That still leaves the Kotel issue for us.

RABBI STEIN The Kotel, sure if someone goes and visits the archeology that is great. There is the paradox that it is easy to feel united when we are there for Kabbalat Shabbat and people are singing. Yet over the years I realized when I was with Women of the Wall how orthodox kids are being abusive. How at an early age children are being taught to be hostile. How children learn to think that the women and those who support religious pluralism are the enemy. This is a moment of Jews turning Jews into enemy. We have to work hard to remember that someone who is different is not a threat. In the orthodox frame difference is a threat.

AYALA What are your thoughts about what we should do in the coming year?

RABBI STEIN Calling on us to be there every Rosh Hodesh. In addition I would like in this coming year to create some personal connection to women who are there on the frontline. I would like to get women to talk to us to take us through the experience. My overall feeling is that we cannot despair. We have to hope. On our congregational travel to Israel in 2016, we took the cable car to the top of Masada. I am afraid of heights and shared it with the guide who told me that she is also afraid. We were scared together. Out of nowhere, in the cable car, some Klezmer musicians started singing and playing their instruments. It took us to a transformative moment of joy. We need to hold on to good moments of connection.

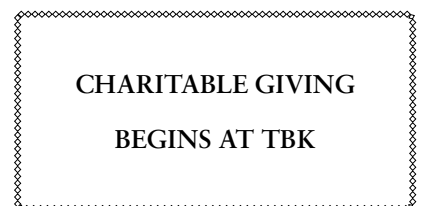
