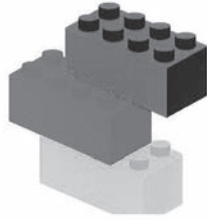

Scholarship Available Through WRJ/TBK Sisterhood Bernstein Award for Judaic Studies

It was renamed in 1986 to honor the memory of Rabbi Philip S. Bernstein, who served as spiritual leader of our temple for more than five decades. In 1999, the fund was redesigned to be a monetary award rather than a loan.

The recipients exemplify all the qualities for which Rabbi Bernstein stood. The award is given based upon commitment to Judaism and sincere interest in the pursuit of studies related to that commitment. The award will be given to persons of high school age and above who have demonstrated an exceptional commitment to Judaism. The scholarship is not based on financial need. Deadline for application is April 15th.

Healing and Hope

From Rabbi Stein



The well-known author Rabbi Harold Kushner has a chapter in one of his books, entitled *Why You Need to be a Jew*.

He writes that “Judaism can save your life from being wasted, from being spent on the trivial.” He goes on to share wisdom learned from many conversations with congregants before surgery or with those who knew they were dying. “What they taught me is that people are not afraid of dying; they are afraid of not having lived. We don’t really want to live forever...we want to live long enough to get it right, to know that we have realized our potential and made a difference to the world.”

We have many members of TBK who exemplify this, who truly make a difference throughout the community. Our members are engaged in so many important projects that it would be impossible to share all of the ways that our members work to create justice, equality and peace.

Many of the projects that we work on together are addressing issues of poverty, hunger, and homelessness. These efforts overlap with our concern for racial justice and our concern for immigrants and refugees. The actions taken by our members make me proud, for they exemplify the central Jewish value of caring for those who are struggling and suffering, treating them as our own.

This bulletin will reach you before we begin the celebration of our two major spring festivals, Purim and Pesach. Both of these holidays remind us to care for those who are in need. Even with the silliness of Purim, we still remember that the holiday includes a tradition of giving tzedakah...and that the story of Queen Esther reminds us to speak up when someone acts with hatred.

Pesach, of course, centers around the retelling of the story of the Israelites being enslaved in Egypt, and then going forth to freedom. The verse that is repeated over and over is that we should remember the experience of having been oppressed...especially by reaching out to those who are oppressed in our own time.

Rabbi Kushner writes further in that chapter that “We don’t change the world just by remembering that we are Jews; we have to do something about it.” I celebrate all of you who “do something about being Jewish” and I further celebrate all the ways that we can use our religious tradition to bring healing and hope to our world.

The donations of these three “T”s are what makes any organization like Temple B’rith Kodesh go.

They’re not always easy to ask for, and oddly, not always easy to give, no matter how much one may care about the organization in question. At different points in one’s life, it may be easier or feel more appropriate to concentrate on supporting an organization like TBK with more focus on one aspect or the other. But it can be a challenge to match needs with offers. It’s a challenge our clergy, staff and Board are investing significant thought and effort into making better, and more accessible, than ever.

Treasure is the most obvious change to date. For many years – for our whole history until this year – there was a top-down definition of what that meant. TBK defined an amount that was expected, and members did their best to work with that. Now, with the roll-out of our Give To Your Heart’s Content model, the paradigm has been reversed. Now we’re asking our members to define what they treasure about TBK, and how they are able to support it from their own resources. And you’re responding! We’ve received many return cards from our mailing, and we are seeing a realignment of support that closely tracks the positive experience of other congregations who have adopted this model. Thank you, and keep it up!

We will soon move into the next phases of this effort, which will include outreach beyond our current Temple family. If you know of someone who’s unaffiliated, please share with them our new model. Our office staff can also provide information to those in the greater Jewish community who may have questions.

In regards to the other two “T”s (time and talent) that together comprise the volunteer efforts it takes to make TBK go, we haven’t forgotten about those either. We are exploring concepts and models to encourage and embrace new ways of utilizing the amazing diversity of skills and interests that comprise our membership. Look for more details in these areas coming this spring, both from a conceptual and a practical point of view.

A hallmark of Temple B’rith Kodesh has always been to honor our traditions while looking ever to the future – a future made bright by the time, talent and treasure so warmly offered by our Temple family.

It supported the Civil Rights Movement and has since worked for racial equality; it paid attention to local poverty and created TEMPRO to house homeless families; it offers food for Thanksgiving for those with few means; it joined faith communities to provide shelter and food for those in need.

In 2017 the Social Action Committee made a Brit, a covenant to strongly support existing projects and expand our commitment to issues of poverty and immigrants/refugees in Rochester. Accordingly, TBK has initiated a partnership with No One Left Behind to assist refugees who saved American soldiers' lives in Iraq and Afghanistan to make a home in our community. We see Tikkun Olam at TBK at its best because whenever there is a mitzvah need, there are always people who grab it and get others involved.

In 2019 the Social Action Committee is planning to expand our commitment to include advocacy at the state level. Not surprisingly, we already have members who stepped up to lead this expanded endeavor. So stay tuned for further details because it may just be your mitzvah. In the meantime it is good to know that TBK is firmly anchored in a long Jewish tradition of Tikkun Olam.

Since we are reading these days the Book of Exodus, it is easy to recognize that Moses teaches practicing Tikkun Olam. It was Moses whose first act as an adult was to go out to his brothers/people and see their burden/suffering. And so it is in our time, we recognize suffering of our fellow human beings and we do our best to make life better.
